Key Priorities	<p>Fundraising Helping others Helping the environment.</p>
Ideas	<p>Fundraising – e.g. helping the homeless, RSPCA, local hospital, Hedgehogs, local Foodbank Help at Christmas for those children who don't have any toys. We need to search for local charities that need support. Helping others Helping the environment e.g. a local litter pick. Raise money for school. We could have an own clothes day. Eva would like some more benches outside school. Seating areas with a roof for children to sit at during playtimes. Another soap dispenser in the girls' bathroom. Suggestions of where to store our own things. Our lockers are not big enough for everything. Extra support for after school.</p>

Raise money by wearing Christmas jumpers. Donating Christmas jumpers for those children who don't have them. We could sell them to raise money too. On special days we could have theme days. E.g. St Patricks day, a donation to wear green.

PE timings. Sometimes we are not getting enough time in the hall because it is still being cleaned after lunch.

Freya suggested a sensory area outside with different zones of regulation. Certain days where nurture club is on at different times so everyone gets chance to go.

A worship garden.

Lots of different sports, including boardgames for those children who don't want to do sports. This could be done with OPAL but also an after school club.

Lonely bench – an area to go to if you have no one to play with so others see that and they can help and support to make sure you do have someone to play with.

Suggestions were made about putting more than one subject in a book so paper wasn't wasted as last year some children didn't fill their whole book.

During worship children would like reflective time so they can say personal prayers.
