Nurses in the Royal College of Nursing ( ACN ) union have voted for the union's first UK-wide strike in its 106 -year history. The action will involve RCN members in more than half of hospitals and community than half of hosppatals and community teams, but emergency carew

Secretary of the RCN, has said nutses Secretary of the RCN, has said nurses are getting an unfair deal and that 'members are saying enough is enough'. She also reports that the strike is for patients as well as workers, because staffing shortages are impacting access to heathcare across the UK. Nursing vacancies are at a record high meaning staff are stretched and regularty working beyond the end of their shifts.
